Proverbs 22:1

A *good* name is rather to be chosen than great riches, and loving favour rather than silver and gold.

- 2 The rich and poor meet together: the LORD is the maker of them all.
- 3 A prudent man foreseeth the evil, and hideth himself: but the simple pass on, and are punished.

Proverbs 22:5

Thorns and snares are in the way of the froward: he that doth keep his soul shall be far from them.

Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.
