Christ Appears To His Disciples

- A. When Jesus' presence is in the house (20:19-20)1. There is peace (v 19)
- John 20:19
- Then the same day at evening, being the first day of the week, when the doors were shut where the disciples were assembled for fear of the Jews, came Jesus and stood in the midst, and saith unto them, Peace be unto you.
- Romans 5:1
- Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

- A. When Jesus' presence is in the house (20:19-20) (continued)
 - 2. There is joy (v 20)
- John 20:20
- And when he had so said, he shewed unto them his hands and his side. Then were the disciples glad, when they saw the LORD.
- **Isaiah 61:10**
- I will greatly rejoice in the LORD, my soul shall be joyful in my God; for he hath clothed me with the garments of salvation, he hath covered me with the robe of righteousness, as a bridegroom decketh himself with ornaments, and as a bride adorneth herself with her jewels.

- B. When Jesus' priorities are in the house (20:21) John 20:21
- Then said Jesus to them again, Peace be unto you: as my Father hath sent me, even so send I you.

Acts 1:8

But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.

- C. When Jesus' power and promise are in the house (20:22)
- John 20:22
- And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and saith unto them, Receive ye the Holy Ghost:
 - 1. To receive life
- Genesis 2:7
- And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and *breathed* into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.'

- C. When Jesus' power and promise are in the house (20:22)
 - 2. To proclaim life
- Luke 24:49
- And, behold, I send the promise of my Father upon you: but tarry ye in the city of Jerusalem, until ye be endued with power from on high.

- D. When Jesus' program is in the house (20:23) John 20:23
- Whose soever sins ye remit, they are remitted unto them; and whose soever sins ye retain, they are retained.

Matthew 18:18

Verily I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall bind on earth shall be bound in heaven: and whatsoever ye shall loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven.

- A. Doubt occurs when you are not where you should be (20:24)
- John 20:24
- But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.

- **B.** Doubt occurs when you have disbelief (20:25) John 20:25
- The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the LORD. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.

C. Doubt disappears when Jesus comes to you (20:26-27) 1. Brings peace (v 26)

John 20:26

And after eight days again his disciples were within, and Thomas with them: then came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace be unto you.

2. Brings answers that you need (v 27)

John 20:27

Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side: and be not faithless, but believing.

- **D.** Doubt is dismissed by declaring when you know (20:28-29)
 - 1. To Thomas seeing was believing (v 28)
- John 20:28
- And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God.

D. Doubt is dismissed by declaring when you know (20:28-29)

2. For us, believing is seeing (v 29)

John 20:29

Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed: blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed.

1 Peter 1:8-9

8 Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory:

9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.
