THE SILENT SAVIOR

ISRIAH 557

Isaiah 53:7

He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.

- A. Isaiah continues developing the details of redemption
 - 1. The Man of sorrows, the despised one (v 3)
 - 2. The smitten Redeemer carrying our sorrows (v 4)
 - 3. The wounded One who brings us peace (v 5)
 - 4. The One who carries the sins of the straying sheep (v 6)

- **B.** The character of Christ
 - 1. His discipline under oppression
- 2. His determination under the pressure of the cross Isaiah 50:7
- For the Lord GOD will help me; therefore shall I not be confounded: therefore have I set my face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be ashamed.
- C. The silence of Christ proclaims His strength Psalm 27:14
- Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.

A. He was arrested though innocent

Matthew 26:56

But how then shall the scriptures be fulfilled, that thus it

must be?



B. He was falsely accused but held His peace Matthew 26:60

But found none: yea, though many false witnesses came, yet found they none. At the last came two false witnesses,



B. He was falsely accused but held His peace Matthew 26:63

But Jesus held his peace, And the high priest answered and said unto him, I adjure thee by the living God, that thou tell us whether thou be the Christ, the Son of God.



C. He was silent when His followers failed Him 1. They forsook Him and fled

Matthew 26:56

But all this was done, that the scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled. Then all the disciples forsook him, and fled.



- C. He was silent when His followers failed Him
 - 2. Peter denied Him three times

Matthew 26:74-75

74 Then began he to curse and to swear, saying, I know not the man. And immediately the cock crew.

75 And Peter remembered the word of Jesus, which said unto him, Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice. And he went out, and wept bitterly.



D. Peter's later description of the silent Savior 1 Peter 2:23

Who, when he was reviled, reviled not again; when he suffered, he threatened not; but committed himself to him that judgeth righteously:

E. He was silent before Pilate Matthew 27:14

And he answered him to never a word; insomuch that the governor marvelled greatly.

I. Christ Was Silent When Oppressed How Are We When Oppressed?

1 Peter 2:20b

....but if, when ye do well, and suffer for it, ye take it patiently, this is acceptable with God.

A. Silent when He was scourged

Matthew 27:26

Then released he Barabbas unto them: and when he had scourged Jesus, he delivered him to be crucified.

- B. Silent when mocked by the soldiers Matthew 27:29-31
- 29 And when they had platted a crown of thorns, they put it upon his head, and a reed in his right hand: and they bowed the knee before him, and mocked him, saying, Hail, King of the Jews!
- 30 And they spit upon him, and took the reed, and smote him on the head.
- 31 And after that they had mocked him, they took the robe off from him, and put his own raiment on him, and led him away to crucify him.

B. Silent when mocked by the soldiers - continued Psalm 22:18

They part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my vesture.


- C. Silent when mocked by the crowd Matthew 27:39-41
- 39 And they that passed by reviled him, wagging their heads,
- 40 And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross.
- 41 Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said,

- D. Paul described His silence
- Philippians 2:5-8
- 5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:
- 6 Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:
- 7 But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:
- 8 And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

B. Isaiah also looks forward to the Lamb of God 1 Corinthians 5:7

Purge out therefore the old leaven, that ye may be a new lump, as ye are unleavened. For even Christ our passover is sacrificed for us:

C. John the Baptist's proclamation John 1:29

The next day John seeth Jesus coming unto him, and saith, Behold the Lamb of God, which taketh away the sin of the world.
